

Service of Process in Europe: Scams and frauds

Nota Bene: Our service of process prices are way more expensive than what you will pay in North America, because of this many international felons offer service of Process in Europe at lower prices, and these are their Scams.

1. The Crows Scam: Originated in U.S.A. Consist of proposing a very cheap Service of Process but a very unnecessary and expensive translation, i.e. Serving in France where documents can be serve without translation.
2. The French Connection: English speaking persons living in mainland Europe propose service of process as intermediaries of an "Attorney" or a "Judicial Officer", then they do service of process by themselves in fraud to local and International Laws.
3. The flying Nun: Process servers from North America or U.K. fly to Europe to serve documents as couriers, this is considered an Illegal Practice of Law within the E.E.C. and violates all Professional, Social and Labor law regulations.
4. Superman: Private Investigators in the United Kingdom and Ireland sell their services of super process servers internationally without specifying that in mainland Europe they are not recognized nor authorize to serve and that without indicating that on mainland Europe service of process is reserved as a monopoly to the legal profession of Barristers-Solicitors or Judicial officers.
5. The Nigerian: Consist of asking for advance fees for service of process that will never be completed, later they do another request of money for translations anduntil you realize you have waived precious judicial time and monies.
6. The Junkie service; You will receive an Affidavit of service signed by "Someone" and if you need to back up service in Court the person does not "exist" or "simply" can not fly to north America.
7. The Peanuts: The Process Server indicates the addressee how much he is being paid for service, the addressee, if not a moron, will double the amount and avoid service, the server will respond to you with a "non found at the address" or "see you later alligator".
8. The Woooppppssss: The server since not licensed can not ask for Identification (In mainland Europe, everybody must have and carry their personal ID Card) serves the wrong person and issues an Affidavit of service which is good for nothing.
9. The Posers: These are databases, associations or companies that in their websites promote International Service of Process, or mention International Service of Process, you hit their website, maybe you register to use their services, or ask for a referral and then, you will note that they do not have International Service of Process services, sometimes you will start receiving "spams".... Their objective is to call your attention about them by misleading you; i.e. "International Process Servers Association" in the United States, has non international Process Servers.
10. The Consular: The U.S.A. foreign service is prohibited by Federal Laws from serving process or to recommend Attorneys or Process Servers abroad, nevertheless the U.S. Consulates maintain a list of "chosen" Attorneys of their "preference". Using any of the "suggested" Attorney from the Consular list, list referred to by the U.S. Foreign Affairs department has as result that you are using not necessarily an English speaking Attorney, an Attorney that does not know what he is doing but a very expensive "recommended" service.
